NZ Racing Board will give away four brand new cars!

The New Zealand Racing Board will give away four brand-new cars over the next two weeks at the last of its Summer Festival events.

As part of the Summer Festival series, which involved 38 family-focused events throughout New Zealand from 26 December to 6 February 2009, the New Zealand Racing Board had four, brand new Nissan Tiida 1.8L automatic cars, worth \$25,000 each, to give away.

To win the car, punters had to buy a \$6 Scoop bet on-course at a Summer Festival event for a particular race. That ticket then had to strike the Summer Six Pack in full (i.e. have all six horses across the line in the correct order) to win the car on top of their share of the guaranteed \$25,000 pool.

So far, no customers have struck the Six Pack in full, so the New Zealand Racing Board has decided the cars must now be won at each of the last three Summer Festival events – no matter what.

New Zealand Racing Board on-course marketing manager Janice Hill said many punters had come close to winning a car with lots of people having the first five horses in the correct order.

“These cars must be won so if nobody strikes the Six Pack in full at the remaining events, then any ticket that has the first five horses in the correct order will go into the draw to win the car.

“If no-one has the first five, then the first four horses in the correct order will go into the draw for the car and so-on.”

Only tickets purchased on-course will be eligible to win the car and the lucky winner must claim the prize within one-hour of the race.

The Summer Festival events where the cars must be won are:

- Invercargill Trots, Friday 30 January 2009 (Race 6 at 6.00pm)
- Oamaru Trots, Sunday 1 February (Race 6 at 2.50pm)
- Tauherenikau Gallops, Friday 6 February (Waitangi Day) (Race 6 at 3.18pm)

A Nissan Tiida car will also be won at the Foxton Trots on Sunday 1 February as part of a separate joint promotion with the Sunday Star Times. This competition is open to all customers and entry is by completing and posting a coupon printed in the Sunday Star Times by 30 January, or by entering on-course at Foxton.

The \$6 Scoop ticket is a \$6 Six Pack Percentage Easybet, which gives customers 32 different computer-generated combinations for the first six horses to cross the finishing line, returning 36per cent of the Six Pack pool.

The Summer Festival programme is run by the New Zealand Racing Board to assist and support racing clubs to develop the on-course customer experience.
